
Restore Gallery's 1st Anniversary

What is an Accredited Hand Therapist?

In 2017, the Australian Hand Therapy Association implemented a credentialing program to ensure accredited therapists offer a high standard of practice.

An Accredited Hand Therapist is a person who:

- is an AHPRA* registered Occupational Therapist or Physiotherapist
- has demonstrated an advanced level of competence in hand therapy
- has undertaken over 300 hours of advanced upperlimb education and assessment; a one-year mentorship; and has a minimum of 3600 hours in hand therapy clinical practice

- has been assessed as qualified and competent to provide safe, evidence-based diagnosis, advice and treatment
- is awarded the credential of Accredited Hand Therapist by the Australian Hand Therapy Association Credentialing Council.

All our Hand Therapists at Restore are AHPRA registered Occupational Therapists.

Jen has been practicing Hand therapy for more than 27 years. She has achieved Accredited Hand Therapy status (AHTA) and the internationally recognised Certified Hand Therapy designation (USA)

Both Emma and Adele are very close to being awarded their (AHTA) Accreditation.
